Protocol Revisions

Ems Radio Template: This is the standard information that will be given by EMS when calling the hospital. The actual form itself is not required to use, but the information on it will be. If needed, additional questions can be asked after the initial report is given. Template is available for download from the Inter-Hospital Committee website. APPROVED

Protocol 4 Scene Release: To be used with refusals and no cares when there has not been contact with medical control. This is just a guideline as most agencies have their own release waiver. APPROVED

Will discuss Alerted Mental Status during the September meeting.

12 Lead EKG

Salt Lake City Fire and South Salt Lake Fire will be online the end of August. Guidelines for Hospitals will be addressed when Dr. Peter Tailac returns from his deployment.

Diversion Report

It was decided that a Stroke Diversion Protocol does not need to be created. A motion was made to leave the diversion protocol as is and explore if it becomes an issue. If you encounter any problems with hospitals diverting please send Dr. Fox an email and she will check into the issue.

Dr. Joyce resigned from the Diversion Sub Committee. New members are needed and will reconstitute the committee if needed.

Financial Update

Setting up a 501(c) (3) account is a very long process. Agencies with this type of account are typically considered charitable organizations and one of

the requirements is contribute to the community. Please be thinking about a service project we can do with some of the funds collected.

It has been five years since we have collected and there is currently \$568.00 in the EMS Inter-Hospital bank account. We will collect again once the account is established.

BEMS

Grant monies have been awarded to most agencies that submitted applications. Some agencies were disqualified due to incomplete applications.

Life Pack 20's have been recalled due to a power supply failure.

Beginning January 1, 2011 EMT-I and Paramedic recertification testing will be required. Department Training Officers will do practical testing in-house.

The requirement for the one-day EMS Instructor certification is still Fire Instructor I, Not Fire Instructor II.

Utah Bureau of EMS and Preparedness developed a five-year strategic plan. This plan includes 15 goals and 76 objectives.
